



1. About HEC:

Healthcare Excellence Canada ("HEC") is a not-for-pro t organization primarily funded by Health Canada. HEC collaborates with people and organizations across the country to spread innovations, build capability and catalyze policy changes that improve healthcare safety and quality. The views expressed herein do not necessarily represent the views of Health Canada.

2. Challenge streams:

For the purposes of the *HEC Health Workforce Innovation Challenge* (the "Challenge"), HEC is challenging healthcare innovators to share and grow their approaches to improving retention and support of the current workforce in either of the following two (2) streams (each a "Stream" and collectively the "Streams"): (i) northern and remote

Eligibility of teams, team leaders, sites, site leaders and team members:

Participating organizations in the Challenge must participate as an eligible Team (de ned below). Each Team must, at minimum, be comprised of: (i) one (1) Team Leader (de ned below); (ii) one (1) or more Lead Sites (de ned below) and a Site Leader (de ned below) of each such Lead Site; (iii) one (1) Team Member (de ned below) who is a senior of cer or director from the Lead Site's organization; (iv) one (1) Team Member who is a licensed or regulated health or social care provider and/or who works as a front-line state for the Lead Site's organization; and (v) one (1) Team Member who is a patient and/or family representative of the Lead Site's organization, involving those who experience and need care. A Team may (but is not required to) also consist of additional Team Members and/or one (1) or more Supporting Sites, as set out below.

Teams and Team Leaders:

For the purposes of the Challenge, a team (a "Team") must be created and registered on the Challenge portal (https://hec-esc.smapply.ca/ – the "Portal") by an individual who is designated as the Team's leader (a "Team Leader"). The Team Leader will: (a) be the primary point of contact for HEC and for Team Members throughout the Challenge; (b) act as coordinator for all of the Team's activities (including, but not limited to, data submission before the appropriate deadlines, cooperation in any veri cation process and Award distribution); (c) be responsible for the Team's Registration (as de ned below) and ensuring that all Sites, Site Leaders and required Team Members register to the Portal in accordance with these Terms; and (d) agree to receive correspondences on behalf of the Team at the email address provided at Registration, which serves as the primary mechanism through which HEC communicates with the Team. Each Team Leader is required to register and identify a minimum of: (a) one (1) Team Member (as de ned below) who is a senior o cer or director from the Team's Lead Site organization, demonstrating endorsement; (b) one (1) Team Member (as de ned below) who is a licensed or regulated health or social care provider and/or who works as a front-line sta for the Team's Lead Site organization and (c) one (1) Team Member (as de ned below) who is a patient and/or family representative of the Team's Lead Site organization, involving those who experience and need care.

To be eligible, a Team Leader must: (a) be a resident of Canada; (b) have reached the legal age of majority in their province or territory of residence; (c) have the unencumbered authority, authorization and permission from each Site (as de ned below), Site Leader (as de ned below) and Team Member (as de ned below) associated with their Team to: (i) register any such Site (as de ned below), Site Leader (as de ned below) and Team Member (as de ned below) for the Challenge as part of their Team, (ii) provide to HEC any and all required information and/or documentation that relates to such Site, Site Leader and Team Member for the purposes18 (s a)r.9TEMC i43maor the Challexperience of theirETEha

Sites and Site Leaders:

For the purposes of the Challenge, a lead site (a "Lead Site") must consist of an organization that provides publicly funded health and/or social services in Canada. Regulated public and private organizations and/or charitable and non-pro t organizations providing health and social care related services in Canada are also eligible.

For the purposes of the Challenge, a supporting site (a "Supporting Site") consists of a private (for-pro t) organization providing health and social care related services. To be eligible to participate in the Challenge, a Supporting Site must participate with (and be registered through a Registration (de ned below) as participating on the same Team as) a Lead Site that has agreed to participate with such Supporting Site.

To qualify for the Challenge, any Lead Site and Supporting Site (each, a "Site") must designate one (1) individual (a "Site Leader") who must be a representative of the Site and meet all other Site Leader eligibility requirements set out below.

Further, the Site Leader must: (a) be a resident of Canada; (b) have reached the legal age of majority in their province or territory of residence; (c) not be ineligible to participate in accordance with the exclusions in Section 4; (d) agree to be legally bound by these Terms and to any other required documentation as contemplated in these Terms; and (e) have the unencumbered authority, authorization and permission to: (i) legally bind the Site to these Terms and to any other required documentation as contemplated in these Terms; and (ii) submit any Data (as de ned below in Section 8) on behalf of the Site to HEC, and otherwise provide to HEC any and all other required information and/or documentation that relates to the Site, for the purposes of administering the Challenge in accordance with these Terms.

A Site may participate on more than one Team, however the Data from one Site may not

4. Additional eligibility rules:

Excluded from participating – individuals:

For the purposes of this Challenge, an individual is not eligible to participate if: (a) they is a director, o cer, employee, representative or agent (or living with any such persons, whether related or not) of HEC or any other individual(s), entity or entities involved in the development, production, implementation, administration, judging or ful Ilment of the Challenge (collectively, the "Challenge Parties"); and/or (b) they does not otherwise satisfy the requirements set forth in these Terms (as determined by HEC in its sole and absolute discretion).

Excluded from Participating – Sites:

For the purposes of this Challenge, a Site is not eligible to participate if it: (a) is located outside of Canada; and/or (b) is a department or agency of the Federal Government of Canada; and/or (c) does not otherwise satisfy the requirements set forth in these Terms (as determined by HEC in its sole and absolute discretion).

Veri cation:

HEC reserves the right, in its sole and absolute discretion, to require proof of identity and/or eligibility (in a form acceptable to HEC) for the purposes of verifying eligibility to participate in the Challenge. Failure to provide such proof to the complete satisfaction of HEC within the timeline specified by HEC may result in disqualification in the sole and absolute discretion of HEC.

Further, HEC reserves the right, in its sole and absolute discretion at any time, to disqualify any Team, Site, Team Leader, Site Leader and/or Team Member—including, but not limited to, if, for example, HEC determines that the Team, Site, Team Leader, Site Leader and/or Team Member (as applicable) to participate in (or continue to participate in) the Challenge could bring HEC into public disrepute or in any way impact the good standing or reputation of HEC in the eyes of the general public. HEC's decisions on all matters arising in this regard shall be nal and binding without right of appeal.

At HEC's sole and absolute discretion, a Team may be required to submit video demonstrations during the Challenge to validate adherence to these Terms. Demonstration videos (or equivalent, as designated by HEC) must meet the requirements deemed to be appropriate by HEC based on the circumstances.

ANY INDIVIDUAL OR ENTITY DEEMED BY HEC TO BE IN VIOLATION OF HEC'S INTERPRETATION OF THE LETTER AND/OR SPIRIT OF THESE TERMS FOR ANY REASON IS SUBJECT TO DISQUALIFICATION IN THE SOLE AND ABSOLUTE DISCRETION OF HEC AT ANY TIME.

Con icts of Interest:

By participating in the Challenge, each Team Leader, Site Leader (on their own behalf and on behalf of their Site) and Team Member is signifying their agreement that they have read and understands HEC's <u>Con_ict of Interest Policy</u> (including, but not limited to, rules regarding the eligibility of HEC employees, directors, registrants and agents). 6. Changes to team composition after registration:

After completing the Team's registration in accordance with Section 5, the Team Leader will be permitted to make the following changes to the composition of their Team throughout the Challenge through the Portal:

- Add new Team Members provided any such new Team Members satisfy the eligibility requirements as set forth in these Terms;
- Remove Team Members;
- Add new Sites provided any such new Sites satisfy the eligibility requirements as set forth in these Terms; and/or
- Remove Sites.

In addition, a Team Leader may assign their designation as Team Leader to another Team Member or Site Leader — provided that such Team Member or Site Leader (as applicable) satis es the eligibility requirements to become a Team Leader as set forth in these Terms.

ET, such Teams may meet the Outcomes Plan requirements above (including, without limitation, submitting the Population Reach and, as applicable, Primary Indicator) by participating in Mini-Challenge #1 as described in Section 11 (participation in Mini-Challenge #1, for certainty, will allow for the eligible submission of the Team's Outcomes Plan, including without limitation the Team's Population Reach and, as applicable, Primary Indicator). For Teams that complete Registration after October 16, 2023, such Teams are not eligible to participate in Mini-Challenge #1 however must still meet the Outcomes Plan (including without limitation the Team's Population Reach and, as applicable, Primary Indicator) requirements described above within sixty (60) days of completing such Registration

8. Reporting Data:

IMPORTANT NOTE: Teams are not required to submit Baseline Data or Reported Data, as set out below, in order to be eligible to participate in the Challenge. However, in order to be eligible for a Mid-Term Retention Progress Award and Overall Retention Achievement Award (each de ned below), a Team must submit Baseline Data or Reported Data, as set out below. For greater certainty, if a Team does not submit Baseline Data or Reported Data, as set out below, such Team will not be eligible for a Mid-Term Retention Progress Award or Overall Retention Achievement Award, however, may be eligible for other Awards in the Challenge based on the criteria set out in Section 11 below.

Baseline Data:

In order to be eligible for a Mid-Term Retention Progress Award and Overall Retention Achievement Award (each de ned below), a Team will be required to provide baseline data (the "Baseline Data") in relation to the Primary Indicator identi ed by the Team (Per Section 7) in accordance with the reporting schedule set forth in Table 2 below. If a Team's Registration is completed before July 31, 2023, then the earliest Baseline Data eligible for that Team will relate to July 2023. For any Registrationolyany Rable 2 below.

Innovation Description Awards:

By September 15, 2023 at 11:59 p.m. ET, Teams can submit a brief Challenge story (a "Story") that introduces their Team Leader, patient and/or family representative, licensed or regulated health or social care provider and/or who works as a front-line sta and senior o cer or director (as set-out in Section 3) and demonstrates: (a) their current work underway relevant to their chosen intervention or pathway; and (b) their intended aim and anticipated outcomes pursuant to their participation in the Challenge.

Stories must meet the following requirements:

- a maximum of 300 written words or maximum of 3 minutes recorded video submitted in acceptable le format (for example, Mp4)
- demonstrate that their current and intended work falls within one (1) of the six (6)
 Indicators (i.e., the thematic areas Per Table 1, Section 7);
- describe the intervention(s) or pathway(s) (as set out in Section 5) being applied to achieve progress against one (1) or more of the six (6) Indicators (i.e., thematic areas per Table 1, Section 7);
- include a quote from at least one user (either provider and/or user) about how the intervention(s) or pathway(s) (as set out in Section 5) has a ected, or will a ect, their experience and/or practice as a clinician or healthcare provider. They must be explicitly identified by name and role in the story.

Stories received by the deadline above will be judged by HEC and given a score (a "Story Score") based on the following weighted criteria: (1) having met the requirements above (50%); and (2) creativity/originality (50%). Each Story must achieve a threshold Story Score of at least 75% (the "Threshold Story Score") (as determined by HEC in their sole and absolute discretion) in order to be eligible to receive an Innovation Description Award. Each Team that submits an eligible Story that obtains one (1) of the top ten (10) Story Scores (and satis es the Threshold Story Score) will be eligible to receive an Innovation Description Award (each, an "Innovation Description Award") as follows:

Each submission must achieve a Threshold Submission Score of at least 75% (as determined by HEC in their sole and absolute discretion) in order to be eligible to receive an Outcomes Measurement Progress Award #1. In the event of a tie between two (2) or more submissions based on Impact Award #1 Scores, then the Team associated with the submission that obtained the highest Impact Award #1 Scores on Criteria 1 criterion will be selected as the eligible recipient of the applicable Award. In the event of an exact tie based on the foregoing, then a new panel of judges will be appointed by HEC to break the tie in accordance with the preceding procedures.

Mid-Term Retention Progress Awards

Starting on or about January 31, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. ET, HEC will calculate, in its sole and absolute discretion based on the Data submitted in accordance with these Terms, the Team's mid-term score (the "Mid-Term Score") based on the combination of the Team's percentage increase between its Baseline Data and its Reported Data (up to and including the Reported Data for December, 2023). In order to be eligible for a Mid-Term Retention Progress Award, the Team must achieve a threshold Mid-Term Score of at least 75% (the "Threshold Mid-Term Score") (as determined by HEC in its sole and absolute discretion). If, in relation to any Stream, there are fewer Teams that satisfy the Threshold Mid-Term Score than there are Mid-Term Retention Progress Awards available to be received, then fewer Mid-Term Retention Progress Awards will be awarded accordingly. Each Team that obtains one (1) of the top six (6) Mid-Term Scores per Stream (and satis es the Threshold Mid-Term Score) will be eligible to receive a Mid-Term Retention Progress Award (each, a "Mid-Term Retention Progress Award") as follows:

Dinosaur Mini-Challenge

By December 1, 2023 at 11:59 p.m. ET, Teams can submit a dinosaur plan, using the template to be provided by HEC with formatting and word count speci cations, identifying and sharing how they decommissioned and/or developed a brief plan to decommission old practices that are no longer contributing to patient safety and quality of care (each, a "Dinosaur Plan"). Dinosaur Plans must be in English or French.

Dinosaur Plan submissions received by the deadline above will be judged by HEC and given a score (a "Dinosaur Mini-Challenge Score") based on the following weighted criteria:


